Bedford, Lexington and Lincoln, bordering Concord. At the base, a mix of active-duty military, civilian and contractor employees develop and acquire sophisticated radar, cyber and information technology-based systems that provide critical battlefield situational awareness to U.S. warfighters. Hanscom's mission expanded in 2013 when the Massachusetts Air and National Guard headquarters relocated their operations to the base. The Base creates more than 3,600 direct and 14,500 indirect jobs for a total of more than18,000 jobs, with a 2011 economic impact of \$8.44 billion for the Commonwealth's economy.

"The innovations at Hanscom and integration with both academia and businesses exemplify the kind of leading technology and highly-skilled workforce that we see at all six of the Commonwealth's bases," said MassDevelopment President and CEO Marty Jones.
